- The appeal is successful and a FORCE out is made at 2nd base. No runs score.
- 2. The appeal is successful, but 3 runs scored. Since this is NOT a force out all runs except the runner missing 3rd score.
- 3. The run scores. This is NOT a force out double play and the run scored before the out is recorded.
- 4. (ASA) The batter runner is out. The out can be recorded if the throw forces the defensive player onto the ORANGE portion of the bag. (SSUSA) the batter runner is NOT out. The WHITE portion of the bag MUST be touched for the out to be recorded.
