Samuel J. Verello Sr., 78, of Columbus, NJ died on Thursday, February 9, 2017 in Naples, FL.

He was born in Brooklyn, NY. He had lived in Edison for 35 years before moving to Columbus in 2016.

He proudly served in the United States Marine Corps and worked for the US Postal Service for 34 years, retiring as Superintendent of Transportation Services for New York City.
